

10 Doctoral Grants & 4 Postdoctoral Positions (€13, 75 %)



The Graduate School of the John F. Kennedy-Institute for North American Studies invites applications for the academic year 2015/2016. The School's program is interdisciplinary in its approach and focuses on the social, economic and cultural changes impacting the United States and Canada at the beginning of the 21st century. The language of instruction is English.

Applicants interested in pursuing a doctoral or postdoctoral research project with an emphasis in North American Studies are expected to submit an outline of their doctoral/postdoctoral research project and must have a completed degree (Master or equivalent/Doctorate) with above average marks in one of the following or closely related academic disciplines:

- American Cultural Studies
- American Literature
- History
- Political Science
- Sociology
- Economics

Funding for postdoctoral researchers will be on the basis of non-renewable two-year contracts. Doctoral grants are awarded for a maximum of three years; candidates with children are eligible for a fourth year of funding. Continued funding is dependent on the doctoral candidate's performance and positive annual evaluations of his/her work.

Doctoral scholarships amount to **1.500 €** per month
Postdoctoral positions (**75%**) are remunerated at **€13** per month
