PERSPECTIVES ON MULTICULTURALISM IN NORTH AMERICA

In 1989, the Kennedy Institute inaugurated a series of "Ringvorlesungen" on different themes each semester. The goal of these lecture series is to familiarize students with the disciplines which are represented at the Institute: literature, culture, linguistics, history, politics, sociology, geography and economics. The object of the lectures is not only to explore a topic related to the semester theme, but also to introduce some of the major research issues, methodologies and reference sources of each of the disciplines.

The semester themes focus on different issues in different semesters; at times the emphasis has been primarily on international relations, at other times primarily on domestic issues. The particular choice is often triggered by issues of current interest as well as by the teaching and research interests of the coordinators.
